Chongqing's Chuanju Opera Troupe travel to Birmingham to spend a week long residency working with Sid Peacock's Surge Orchestra.

The Chongqing Theatre of Chongqing Municipality was established in 1955. It grew out of Chongqing Experimental Chuanju Opera Theater (founded in 1951). The company has received awards at the First National Traditional Opera Emulation Performance Meeting and Southwest Region Drama Joint Performance organisation in numerous categories including opera, director, performance, music composition, and stage art. The company enjoys a distinguished international reputation and has performed thought the world.

In 2014 Sid was British Council/PRSF musician in residence at Chongqing Chuanju Opera. He has been working again with them this year in Chongqing and Shanghai at the Xintiandi World Music festival. In partnership with Midlands Arts Centre the concert will present a unique and fiery fusion of Chuanju Opera Styles, folk, roots and groove.

Pianist and composer Steve Tromans performs with young saxophonist and composer, Olivia Murphy and his Dead As Dillinger Band, featuring Tymoteusz Jozwiak on drums, Richard Scott on viola and vocals and Sarah Farmer on violin.

Steve's playing is a key part of the Surge Orchestra and the Peacock Angell Band; his projects include setting Allen Ginsberg's Howl poem to music, a tribute to the Chilean revolutionary singer songwriter Victor Jara, and the Musickosmos Suite for the Town Hall Symphony Hall Sounds of Space weekend.

In 2013 he spearheaded a project which brought together improvising musicians from Birmingham (UK) and Chicago, an ensemble which gave performances at key underground venues in Chicago and which was featured on BBC Radio Three's "Jazz on 3" programme on two occasions. In 2016 and 2018 he was part of the Paul Dunmall and Hamid Drake Quintet tours of the UK - a venture which has resulted in two albums to date.

KRAR Collective

Krar Collective serve up a colourful feast of funked-up Ethiopian grooves based on traditional music.

Led by Temesgen Zeleke, a former student of Ethiojazz legend Mulatu Astatke, Krar Collective perform a rootsy yet contemporary take on traditional music from Ethiopia based on other-worldly modes and driven by hypnotic rhythms. The traditional acoustic krar lyre is associated with the azmari minstrel tradition; electrified, in the hands of Zeleke it becomes a gritty, ancient rock guitar.

Accompanied just by traditional and supertight kebero drums played by Grum Begashaw and fronted by stunning vocals of Genet Assefa, Krar Collective create a surprisingly full band sound, leading one critic to name them 'The Ethiopian White Stripes'. With songs that journey from gently, rippling acoustic numbers to truly rabble-rousing, this music that is at once African, and yet unique to Ethiopia will move your soul and rock your feet.
