Kadialy Kouyate

Kadialy Kouvate is a musician, a singer songwriter inspired by the West African Griot repertoire. Born into the great line of Kouvate Griot in Southern Senegal, Kadialy's mesmerising kora playing and singing style have been appreciated in many prestigious venues as both a soloist and in different



Since his arrival in the UK Kadialy has played a significant part in enriching the London musical scene with his griot legacy. He has been teaching the Kora at Soas university of London for the last decade and he has also been involved in countless musical projects both as a collaborator and a session musician.

Mike Fletcher

The Mike Fletcher Jazz Orchestra began life in Birmingham in 2006 as a group of young musicians with a shared love of the long and varied tradition of big band music from Count Basie and Duke Ellington to Thad Jones and beyond. Since this time the focus of the project has evolved along with Mike's interest in more experimental large ensemble composition, although still retaining a clear link to the music's rich history. The 12-piece line-up is slightly reduced from the more traditional '16 men swinging', and makes for a more nimble formation that nevertheless retains the power of a full big band. Germa Adan writes and performs a tapestry of rich vocal and stringed harmonies, influenced by the overlapping identity with cultures, especially so in the Haitian, American and British folk influences that colour her sound.

Richard Laird is a singer/songwriter for Londonderry, Northern Ireland.Richard has been composing songs and music for over 20 yrs around the theme of reconciliation, Ireland and World War

Richard Scott and Iryna Muha's performance is their first commission as a duo centered around their shared interest in drone-based and harmonic European folk traditions. Richard is an artist and musician with interests in improvised experimental music and Scandinavian folk. Iryna Muha is a Ukrainian born singer, songwriter, hurdy-gurdy and guitar player.

Melinda Maxwell and Callum Armstrong form a unique partnership to present music for ancestral and modern reed instruments: the ancient Greek aulos, the modern oboe and the bagpipes. The music is derived from their experience as improvisers, composers and performers in the worlds of folk, jazz and contemporary classical music.

Courtyard/Foyer

Moseley Misfits is a community music group for adults who play any instrument to any ability. We play a mixture of folk, pop. film scores and pieces that have been collectively composed by the group.

The Jazzlines Ensemble provides young musicians from Birmingham and the surrounding areas with the opportunity to develop their ensemble playing skills and learn more about jazz and improvisation through regular workshops and masterclass sessions. The sessions are open to young musicians of all abilities, from beginners to advanced and are free to young musicians aged between 11 and 19 from Birmingham and the surrounding areas

Birmingham Ormiston Academy is a specialist performing arts school in central Birmingham. Our BOA Jazz and Funk band rehearse every Friday with their band leaders Xhosa Cole (current BBC Young jazz Musician of the Year), Robbie Moore and Ray Prince, where they practise their own compositions as well as jazz standards

Mendi Singh is a classically trained tabla player-composer and a musical visionary, being one of UK's most celebrated tabla specialists with his activity within a variety of ensembles and bands taking him around the world.
