MARIO BATKOVIC WITH SUPPORT FROM HYELIM KIM

Mixing classical and contemporary sounds, Mario Batkovic explores the sonic possibilities of his instruments, without effects or loops, rather through a mutualist symbiotic relationship between man and instrument. Challenging, hypnotic and grandiose; Batkovic's symphonic vision is unique. He has received widespread critical acclaim, including from Rolling Stone magazine who voted his selftitled debut album in the Top 10 'Best Avant Albums of 2017.'

Supporting Mario is performer, composer and researcher Hyelim Kim. Her aim is to open new possibilities for Korean music and to promote exchange with a wide variety of musical cultures. She was identified as a pioneering artist by the Korean Arts Council and has been afforded many other opportunities and prizes both in Korea and in the UK. Her debut recording Nim: Hyelim Kim Taegŭm Collection (Universal) includes traditional pieces alongside her own compositions.

In the virtuoso hands of Zeleke, the ancient krar lyre becomes a gritty rock guitar, weaving around the stunning vocals of Genet Assefa and the driving rhythms of Amare Mulugeta on traditional kebero drums. The line-up has recently expanded to include virtuoso Baby Masinko on the extraordinary one-stringed Ethiopian masinko fiddle and Dawit Seyoum on bass krar for added funkiness!
